From the Master **Captain Marshall Dunbar**

Good Day Everyone,

It is almost spring and with that comes the nautical skills competition(s) time. The Maritimes Division again sponsored the NSCC event and I greatly appreciate our members who represented the organisation and assisted with making the competition a success.

Congratulations to all the students participated in the event and you are the future mariners who will go on and enjoy a career in an amazing industry.

The Marine Institute in St. John's also held their Skills competition and congratulations to them on another successful event.

I am fortunate enough to be able to take some time and travel right now and presently I am in Portugal. The last time I was here it was for a very brief period. I was Chief Officer on an AFRAMAX crude oil tanker owned and operated by Sanko Lines and we arrived at Setubal (Lisbon) to enter dry dock. Prior to that we had discharged a cargo of crude oil in Italy after loading it in North Africa. Then we did cargo tank washing and ballast tank inspections enroute to Setubal. After going onto the dry dock, I departed the next day and travelled to Tokyo for my promotional interview for Captain at Sanko's head office. After 3 days at Tokyo, I travelled to Houston to join another Sanko tanker as Captain. Obviously not much time to enjoy Lisbon and all that it has to offer.

One thing I did go to see this time was the Maritime Museum. Portugal has a very long nautical history (exploration, colonisation and cod fishery) and both Ferdinand Magellan and Vasco da Gamma are of Portuguese descent. Some photos of my visit to this museum are included.

The St. Lawrence Seaway will start start their 2023 season on 22 March. This waterway system is a major mover of goods and is within a short distance of over 100 million citizens of Canada and the USA. It provides opportunities both for USA and Canadian seafarers, along with all the workers that support this system. To all MMC members would earn their living from the

Seaway, I hope that you have another successful and safe season.




